Airport Security Measures May Be Here To Stay

Stringent security measures that are now in place in Canada's airports will remain until the threat of terrorism no longer exists.

Jacques Duchesneau, CEO of the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority, said the original 48 to 72-hour time-frame for the new security restrictions may be extended.

"They are indeterminate," Duchesneau said of the restrictions, which include a ban on most liquids in carry-on luggage.

"We do threat assessments with Transport Canada and all our colleagues ... and we will determine if the threat is still there or not, and depending on the threat assessment we'll take measures."

Public Safety Minister Stockwell Day held out hope that there may be some way to relax new regulations banning liquids and gels from carry-on baggage, but added that has yet to be determined "so it's an ongoing evaluation."

The rules were imposed Thursday after Britain announced that it had foiled a major terrorist plot to blow up airliners en route to the United States using liquid-based explosives.

"We're doing the evaluation right now to see if it's going to extend beyond the 72 hours," Day said in Vancouver.

The federal government also announced that it plans to tightly regulate nine chemicals

that could be used by terrorists to build bombs, including concentrated forms of hydrogen peroxide.

Security was beefed up and strict limits were put on carry-on luggage Thursday after police in the UK arrested more than 20 suspects in an alleged plot to bomb 10 planes flying to the U.S.

The measures included a ban on liquids, including bottled water, coffee, hair gel and shampoo. However, exceptions were made for prescription medication, baby formula, breast milk and essential non-prescription medication.

"These measures are in place to stay, for now," Duchesneau told reporters.
